<u>Infectious Diseases</u>

We have been informed of a case of Scarlett Fever within the school. Please see below advice:

"The symptoms of scarlet fever are nonspecific in early illness and may include sore throat, headache, fever, nausea and vomiting. After 12 to 48 hours the characteristic red, generalised pinhead rash develops, typically first appearing on the chest and stomach, rapidly spreading to other parts of the body, giving the skin a sandpaper-like texture. If you are concerned that you or your child could have scarlet fever, you should **contact your GP**. Children or adults diagnosed with scarlet fever are advised to stay at home until at least 24 hours after the **start of antibiotic treatment** to avoid spreading the infection to others."
